Minutes of the Meetings

The first meeting of the academic year was convened on 31st July 2019 at 10.50am at conference hall-I with the following agenda

Dissemination of code of conduct:

The chairperson of the committee informed the members that the code of conduct has to be briefed to the new entrants during the orientation programme and the same has to be printed in the college calendar that will be distributed to the students in their respective classrooms.

Discipline on campus:

The chairperson informed the committee members that students should be informed that wearing ID cards on campus is mandatory and should follow the dress code and grooming etiquettes. If any cases of violation are observed in this regard, the concerned students' ID cards have to be taken and should be handed over to the student on the same day with a warning and advice from the Disciplinary committee members.

The members were also informed that incase of usage of mobile phones by students on campus in academic areas or in class hours, their cell phones have to be confiscated and submitted to the Principal.

The chairman informed the members that in case of any misbehavior or violation of the college rules, the ID cards of the students will be confiscated and will be with the Disciplinary Committee members till the enquiry is completed.

He also explained how a person addicted to drugs not only affects the individual but also one's family by presenting appropriate examples. A session on Professional ethics and its importance was organized on 23/09/2019 by the department of Electronics and communication and Engineering in association with the Disciplinary committee for the third year ECE students. Prof. Jayadev Prasad was the resource person for this event. Prof. Prasad in his discussion communicated that an organization strives ceaselessly to be in pursuit of its goals while benefiting the employees in developing their high competencies. Toward this path, the adherence to high ethical standards of the employees can be

particularly contributory to the noteworthy accomplishments of business goals being turned out as planned and intended.

He additionally advised that Ethics refers to human conduct as to make decisions between what is right and what is wrong. It could be that there are several factors that may encourage one to adopt unethical behaviour, however the correct individual is he who, in spite of confronting ethical dilemmas, assesses the situations and makes differentiation between what is ethically acceptable and awful to keep the guidelines and code of professional conduct.

He referenced a portion of the significant dangers which are unsafe for the working environment ethics, for example cheating, black money accumulation and dishonesty with data which affects the customers by misleading advertisements. He also gave insights of insider trading which is illegal to make profit with prior known information and also about conflicts of interest where maintaining close relationships effects the growth of the individual and can also hinder the organizations growth.

A session on Professional Ethics and its importance was organised on 25/09/2019 by the department of Electronics and Communication Engineering in association with the Disciplinary committee for third year ECE students. Mrs. Verina was the resource person for this session. Mrs. Verina explained about two types of ethics which are Personal and Organization ethics, Personal ethics is a category of philosophy that determines what an individual believes about morality and right and wrong. This is usually distinguished from business ethics or legal ethics. These branches of ethics come from outside organizations or governments, not the individual's conscience. These branches of ethics occasionally overlap. Personal ethics can affect all areas of life, including family, finances and relationships. She likewise referenced that Organizational ethics are the principles and standards by which organizations work, according to Reference for Business. They are best exhibited through demonstrations of decency, empathy, trustworthiness, honor and obligation.
