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To ensure a conducive academic atmosphere for newly enrolled students in college and hostel premises, measures were discussed during Anti-Ragging Committee meetings held on the following dates

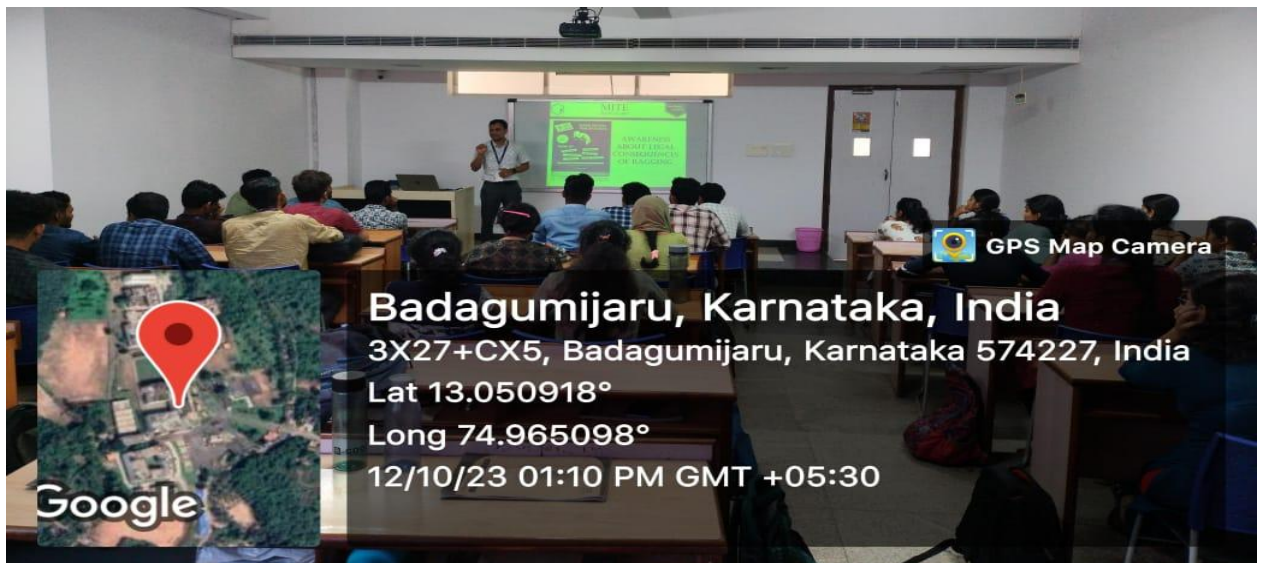

Based on the discussions in the meetings held on the mentioned dates, the following measures have been implemented

- In addition to the Anti-Ragging squad, separate vigilance teams comprising faculty members were also formed. These teams conducted scheduled visits to various locations, including the food court during tea and lunch breaks, parking areas, college buses, the vicinity outside the main gate, and both the boys' and girls' hostels. The vigilance teams recorded their observations in log registers placed at each of these locations. The details of the vigilance team visits are as follows

Team 5	Girls Hostel 6.00 PM to 7.30 PM	Monday to Sunday

- At the beginning of the academic year, as part of our regular practice, the heads of all departments and faculty members visited the classes of senior students in their respective departments to raise awareness about the following:
 - What Constitute ragging
 - The legal consequences of ragging
 - Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti-Ragging Squad constituted for the academic year 2023-24
 - The procedure for filing online Anti-Ragging affidavit
 - Details providing guidance to students in case of ragging
- Presentations covering all of the above information were delivered by the convener of the Anti-Ragging Committee to first-year students during their induction program. Students were urged not to engage in any such harmful practices and to actively participate in making the campus ragging-free.
- All students have filed online Anti-Ragging affidavits, and the reference numbers have been duly collected.

- The Anti-Ragging posters provided by UGC were displayed in prominent locations, including classrooms, food courts, notice boards, college website, hostels, and college buses. Details of the Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti-Ragging Squad constituted for the academic year 2023-24, along with the contact information of all committee members, were also prominently displayed in these areas.

- The committee has decided to retain Mr. Sathisha, Dean of Examination, as the Nodal Officer for Anti-Ragging matters at the institutional level for the academic year 2023-24.
- Faculty members who commuted daily in college buses were instructed to monitor the activities of senior students during the bus journey and record their observations in the log register kept on the buses.
- To create a safe and comfortable travel experience for first-year students, a specific seating arrangement was implemented: first-year students were seated in the front, faculty members in the middle, and senior students behind the faculty members. This arrangement ensured that their commute was a pleasant and secure.
- In addition to the measures mentioned above, it was decided to continue our regular practices, such as:
 - Arranging a separate ‘early mess’ for first-year students by scheduling their tea break and lunch break at different times from seniors.
 - Housing first-year students and senior students in separate hostel blocks to prevent any incidents of ragging.
 - Ensuring the proper functioning of CCTV cameras installed in vital areas.
- The resident wardens of both boys’ and girls’ hostels regularly monitored student behavior and interactions during meal times, fostering a secure and welcoming atmosphere for first-year students.
- Starting from the academic year 2024-25, it was decided to collect details of students residing in private and government hostels, as well as paying guest accommodations, and share this information with the local police for enhanced vigilance. The vigilance team would also conduct regular visits to these locations. Police Sub-Inspector Mr. Siddappa requested prior notice of these visits so that police constables could be dispatched to ensure additional security.
- The Anti-Ragging Squad and Vigilance Team members played a crucial role in ensuring the safety and comfort of newly enrolled students. The Vigilance Team regularly visited the hostels,



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interacted individually with first-year students, and assisted them in resolving both academic and personal challenges.

- Feedback on the Anti-Ragging measures implemented at the institutional level, as well as the effectiveness of the Anti-Ragging Squad and Vigilance Teams, was collected from first-year students. Approximately 97% of the students rated the overall measures as 'VERY GOOD.'

The effective involvement of the Anti-Ragging Committee, Anti-Ragging Squad, and all staff, coupled with the proactive measures taken to ensure the safety and comfort of newly enrolled students, successfully maintained a homely and friendly atmosphere on the MITE campus, reinforcing our commitment to a 'RAGGING FREE' environment.

The regular interactions by the Vigilance Team with first-year students, as well as the consistent monitoring and support provided, played a significant role in helping students navigate both academic and personal challenges. Feedback collected from first-year students highlighted the effectiveness of these efforts,

It is also worth noting that 'NO CASES' of ragging were reported on campus during the academic year 2023-24. This achievement underscores our unwavering commitment to creating a safe, inclusive, and supportive learning environment for all students. The dedication of the Anti-Ragging Squad, Vigilance Team, and all involved staff members has been instrumental in upholding these standards, ensuring that MITE remains a model institution in fostering a culture of respect and safety.
