It is also entrusted with investigating reported cases of ragging and promptly submitting them to the Anti-Ragging Committee for necessary action. The Anti-Ragging Squad was constituted on 18/09/2025 for the academic year 2025–26, in accordance with AICTE regulations on the prevention and prohibition of ragging in AICTE-approved technical institutions, as specified in Regulation No. 37-3/Legal/AICTE/2009 dated 01/07/2009. The Squad works towards maintaining a safe and secure campus with a strong commitment to a “**ZERO RAGGING**” environment.

To ensure a conducive academic atmosphere for newly enrolled students in the college and hostel premises, various measures were discussed during Anti-Ragging Committee meetings held on the following dates:

Based on the discussions in the meetings held on the mentioned dates, the following measures have been implemented:

In addition to the Anti-Ragging Squad, separate vigilance teams comprising faculty members were established. These teams conducted scheduled rounds at various locations, including the food court during tea and lunch breaks, parking areas, college buses, the main entrance, and both boys' and girls' hostels. Their observations were systematically recorded in log registers placed at each of these locations. The details of the vigilance team visits are as follows:

At the start of the academic year, in line with our established practice, the heads of all departments, along with faculty members, visited the classes of senior students in their respective departments to raise awareness on the legal implications and consequences of ragging.

During the First-Year Induction Programme, the Anti-Ragging Committee Convener Dr. Jyothi S and Dr. Ganesh Mogaveer, HoD, Civil Engineering, sensitized students on the institution's zero-tolerance policy on ragging and the importance of a safe and inclusive campus. All students completed the online Anti-Ragging Affidavit submission, and reference numbers were duly collected.

Faculty members travelling on college buses were assigned to monitor student activities and record observations in the bus logbook. A designated seating arrangement, with first-year students seated in the front, faculty in the middle, and senior students at the rear, was implemented to ensure a safe and comfortable journey for first-year students..

The details of students residing in private and government hostels, as well as paying guest accommodations were collected and this information was shared with the local police for enhanced

vigilance. The vigilance team would also conduct regular visits to these locations. Police Sub-Inspector Mr. Siddappa requested prior notice of these visits so that police constables could be dispatched to ensure additional security

YaARI week 2025-Youth Against Ragging Initiative:

The Anti-Ragging Committee, MITE, organized YaARI Week 2025 (Youth Against Ragging Initiative) from 22–26 September 2025 to promote awareness, empathy, and unity among students. The programme highlighted the legal, ethical, and emotional consequences of ragging. The Principal, Dr. Prashanth C. M., emphasized a safe and respectful campus, while the Guest of Honour Mr. Sandesh, Inspector of Police, Moodabidri Police Station, highlighted the legal consequences and encouraged students to report incidents without fear.

The results were highly encouraging, with approximately 89% of students rating the overall Anti-Ragging initiatives as "Very Good." This positive feedback highlights the students' strong confidence in the institution's commitment to maintaining a safe, secure, and supportive environment, while ensuring their overall well-being throughout their academic journey.
